

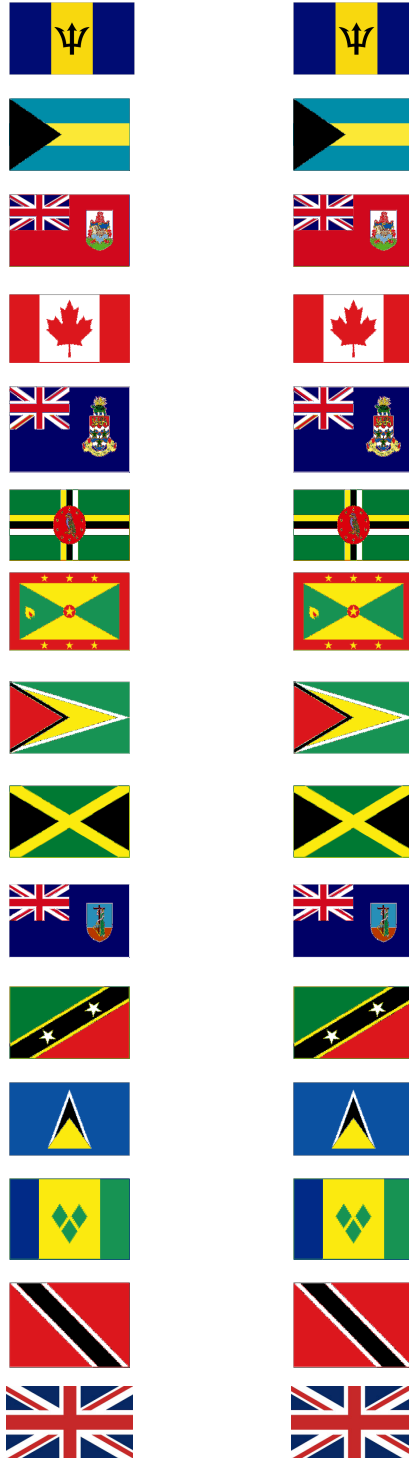

SHOOTING



The aim of this challenge is for cadets to demonstrate their marksmanship skills by engaging falling plates over 10 m using the .177 air rifle .

The team for this event will comprise five (5) cadets. It must include a minimum of two (2) females. At least one cadet must be under 16 years of age.

Points will be awarded for the number of targets hit during the allotted time. Additional points may be accumulated (1)-for knocking down all the targets within the allotted time and (2)-for any pellets returned after a complete knockdown.

TEAM TIMED RUN



This event will require a team of eight (8) cadets, including at least three (3) females and two (2) juniors. The team will be transported to a point 1.5 miles outside of the campsite from where they will return to the finish point on camp along the roadway. The sum of the eight individual times recorded will be the final team time.

Each team will start off together at staggered times.



INTERNATIONAL CADET CONCERT

Each contingent will be expected to prepare two cultural items to be presented at the International Cadet Concert. Items may comprise song (voice or instrumental), or dance, .

Presentations must be either solos or duets..

Judging will focus on professionalism, talent, presentation and personal confidence.

It should be borne in mind that both international performers Rihanna and Ms. Shontelle Layne are recent graduates of the Barbados Cadet Corps.

FOREWORD

The Barbados Cadet Corps will be hosting the third International Cadet Challenge Camp (ICCC) during the summer of 2011 at its Youth Training Centre. Cadet Forces should indicate on or before 31 March 2011 their interest in participating.

The highest authority of the ICCC is the Commandant of the Barbados Cadet Corps. It will be his sole responsibility to make final decisions on any controversial situation or difficulties of any kind, which may arise during the events.

From Monday 1 August – Thursday 10 August 2011 the camp will feature a series of exercises designed to challenge the cadets in a competitive environment.

The objectives are:

- to strengthen the relationships among regional and international Cadet Forces;
- to exhibit the high standards and talents within the various Cadet Forces;
- to provide an opportunity for cadets to engage in friendly rivalry; and
- to demonstrate to the public that cadet training can lead to the development of outstanding citizens.

The teams will comprise cadets from 14 to 18 years. They will participate in a number of disciplines including:

- (a) Track and Field / Sports
- (b) Fun activities
- (c) Military challenges
- (d) Cultural activities

Each Corps/Force will also be expected to provide a cadet to participate in a Youth Forum (Public Speaking), which will address a relevant international topic.

Teams will be required to meet the cost of their airfare and other non camp related activities including shopping and any extra tours desired.

The Barbados Cadet Corps will cover the cost of meals, accommodation, local transport, equipment, tours and other camp activities.

Competition safety is a prime concern. The Barbados Cadet Corps will conduct and submit a Risk Assessment for the competition. The rules have been written with safety in mind, but common sense and caution are required at all times.

ICCC TEAM CRITERIA

CADET SELECTION

Each participating cadet must meet the following criteria:

- (a) Be a minimum of 14 years by 31 December 2011 and not older than 18 years by December 31, 2011.
- (b) Be a member of his/her cadet force for at least one full year.
- (c) Be in possession of a medical certificate issued and stamped by a certified medical practitioner or institution, certifying that he/she is fit to participate in the activities of the camp.
- (d) Be of exemplary character and able to demonstrate a high level of personal discipline.
- (e) Present a Consent Form from their parents/guardians.

TEAM SELECTION GUIDELINES

Each participating team must meet the following criteria:

- (a) Each full team must comprise a minimum of 12 and a maximum of 15 cadets between the ages of 14 and 18 years. **In special cases, a reduced team may be permitted to participate in the ICCC with at least eight (8) cadets.**
- (b) There must be no fewer than three (3) cadets under age 16.
- (c) At least one cadet must be at each age between 14 and 18 years.
- (d) There must also be a minimum of six (6) boys and six (6) girls.
- (e) There must be two (2) or three (3) adult officers, (of whom at least one (1) must be male and one female,) responsible for each team..
- (f) The Team Manager and/or Coach must be selected from among the adult officers.
- (g) Unless prior arrangements are made, a rate of US \$50.00 per day will be charged for any persons in excess of the maximum number permitted.

ICCC EVENT CRITERIA

TRIATHLON

The challenge of this event is to test the competitors' ability to perform in three disciplines at an optimum level.

- (a) The triathlon will consist of the following three (3) events:
 - (i) a 100m swim
 - (ii) a 500m cycle race
 - (iii) a 500m road race



- (b) The event will consist of two levels of participation. 1 – Individual
2— Team
- (c) The Individual competitor must complete ALL THREE legs of the event.
- (d) The team competing in this event must comprise three (3) cadets with a minimum of one (1) female **or** one (1) junior. One cadet will complete each leg for the team.

DRILL COMPETITION

The Drill Competition requires a squad of cadets to complete a sequence of drill movements under the command of a cadet squad leader. The following criteria will apply:

- (a) The team for this event shall consist of 11 persons including ten (10) team members and a squad leader, with a minimum of four (4) females. Two (2) cadets must be under the age of sixteen.
- (b) The competition will be divided into three (3) segments:
 - (i) Inspection of cadets and uniform
 - (ii) Precision Drill sequence - 5 minutes
 - (iii) Creative Drill Display - 3 minutes

ICCC EVENT CRITERIA

SURVIVAL CAMP



The Survival Camp is designed to test the cadets' ability to survive overnight in a field setting. All cadets in the team will participate in this event. The team will be required to effectively setup their own camp, prepare meals and complete a number of set command tasks. Points will be assigned for good military skills, leadership, good teamwork and meeting set objectives.

SPORTS DAY

This will be an entire packed day of track, field and sports competition. Competitors will be classified in Under-15, Under-17, and Under-19 Age Groupings for the Novelty and Sprint Events, and Under-17 and Under-19 Age Groupings for the Relays. There will be some 50 events including:

- Tug-O-War 1200",
- 3 x novelty events – Sack Race, Bottle Relay, and Military Challenge.
- 2 x OPEN events – 3000 m and Team Tennis Ball Throw.
- 80 m Dash and 50 m Dash.
- 100 m, 300/400 m, 200 m Sprints.
- 3 each – 4 x 100m, 2 x 200m, 4 x Medley Relays
- ALL RACE EVENTS WILL BE TIMED FINALS, with the competitors being ranked based on times.

ORIENTEERING

Team Orienteering Challenge to be an advanced Cross-Country Score Course, with an expected finish time of 2 hrs.
The Individual Orienteering Challenge is to be a Line Orienteering Course, with an expected finish time of 1 hour.
The Orienteering Challenge will feature courses in the Scotland District area of Barbados, and will be planned such that orienteering skills (fast map reading, running in rough terrain, finding the best route, thinking on the move) rather than luck, will most likely decide the outcome of the competition. The courses will be supported by reliable maps, unambiguous control points, accurate placement of control points on the map, and good and challenging course legs between the control points.

GENERAL

ICCC 2011 is intended to be a highly focused, intense, challenging competition which is targeted at mature cadets who exemplify the very best training in their various units.

The program is deliberately intense, the timings will be strictly adhered to, and standards will be set very high.

In special cases where the ICCC experience could be an inspiration for cadets from a country which may be in the rebuilding phase, such a team will be welcome to participate. **However in no case will teams of fewer than eight (8) cadets be accepted.**

Below is a list of the challenges that will comprise the **ICCC2011**. As before, points will be assigned based on the position of each team in each official event.

Position 1 will receive 100 points; position two, 90 points; and position three will be awarded 80 points etc.

For each event specific details will be issued in Bulletin No. 2 detailing the exact rules and scoring procedures.

ICCC EVENT CRITERIA

COMMANDANT'S CHALLENGE



In this Challenge, cadets will be tested in **field craft skills** and **section battle drills, leadership and tactics** using state-of-the art electronic weapons. Each team competing in this event must consist of six (6) cadets, with a minimum of two (2) females. Two (2) cadets must be under 16 years of age.

During familiarization training, teams will be exposed to training and practice with the electronic equipment and the terrain.

An adult team coach may be appointed to assist with tactics and planning, however the coach must not intervene once the competition commences.

OBSTACLE COURSE

In this event, each team will be required to complete a typical military obstacle course. It will be a timed event with penalties applied for improper or unsafe obstacle tactics. All safety equipment specified and provided must be used.

The teams competing in this challenge event must each comprise of eight (8) cadets, including a minimum of three (3) females. At least two (2) of the cadets must be under 16 years of age.

The event will consist of the following phases:

1. A sub-group of (5) cadets will do the course. Teamwork will be permitted. The sub-group time will be the time taken for the last cadet to cross the finish line.
2. The three remaining cadets will each do the course individually.

The Official time for the team will be the total of the three individual runs, added to the group time.

ICCC EVENT CRITERIA

YOUTH FORUM /PUBLIC SPEAKING

The Youth Forum is designed

- to give cadets practical experience in the fundamental skills of public speaking and
- to give cadets from a variety of nations and backgrounds a chance to meet, exchange views and form friendships.

The following criteria will apply:

- (a) Each team will be expected to provide **two (2)** cadets who are to make the presentation during the seminar. Other team members may be used for any needed technical or artistic roles.
- (b) The participants will be allowed to present for a minimum of eight (8) and a maximum of twelve (12) minutes on one of the following topics;

1. *Discuss the pros and cons of cultural penetration in your country.*
2. *What more do you think that government and non-governmental bodies can do to improve the environment?*
3. *Discuss the impact of lifestyle diseases on youth in your country.*
4. *Can young people live without technology in our society?*

By June 30 2011, each team will be required to submit the topic that they will be presenting, as well as a list of all audio visual and other aids that they will require. In the event that a listed item is deemed to be unavailable, the team will be required to adjust their presentation accordingly.
